NOTICE TO BID

The City of Aurora is accepting sealed bids for the supply and delivery of Asphalt overlay and resurfacing of designated City Streets. Sealed bids marked “**Asphalt Bid**” must be received in the City Clerk’s Office at Aurora City Hall, at 2 West Pleasant (P.O. Box 30), by **Monday, April 10, 2023 at 10:00 a.m.**, when they will be publicly opened.

All bidders must comply with the Department of Labor’s Prevailing Wage Order No. 29. The City reserves the right to reject or accept any or all proposals or portions of a proposal.

ASPHALT BID
BID INSTRUCTIONS

1. **To be considered as a complete and qualified bid all bid packets must include the following documents:**
 - A. City of Aurora Bid Form for the Asphalt Bid must be typewritten or completed in ink and signed by an authorized official of the firm or all partners if a partnership.
 - B. Support or supplementary documentation and warranty information, as requested in the attached bid specifications.
 - C. Certificate of Insurance showing all levels of insurance as described in the bid specifications.
 - D. Section 285.530.2 of the Missouri Revised Statutes requires a political subdivision as a condition of a contract or grant in excess of \$5,000 to require the business entity to affirm by sworn affidavit and provision of documentation the business entity has enrolled and participates in a federal work authorization program with respect to the employees who work in connection with the contracted services. The Contractor must provide a signed affidavit affirming that it does not knowingly employ any person who is an unauthorized alien in connection with the contract.
 - E. Bid must be submitted according to **Prevailing Wage Order No. 29** as described in bid specifications.
 - F. Bidder must provide Federal Tax ID No. or Social Security Number whichever is used to file income tax documentation.
 - G. Bidder must provide an acceptable form of ID to provide proof of lawful presence pursuant to RSMo 208.009 as described in bid specifications.
 - H. Bidder must include with the submission of their formal bid a Bid Bond equal to ten percent (10%) of the total bid value as described in bid specifications.
 - I. Completed W-9 form.
 - J. Bidder must furnish a list of references with contact persons and telephone numbers.
2. All bids should be firm prices exclusive of all taxes.
3. Bids should include all labor, equipment, insurance and materials to perform the duties outlined in the bid specifications.

4. It shall be the Bidder's responsibility to obtain a current City of Aurora Contractor's License all permits associated with this project and make sure the area is clear of any utilities.
5. The City of Aurora encourages the purchase and use of products, manufactured, assembled or produced in the United States; providing the quality of the goods or services is comparable with goods and services not produced in the United States.
6. The City reserves the right to check all references necessary to determine the firm's ability to perform the work bid.
7. Terms and conditions will be negotiated with the successful Bidder and approved by the City Council, upon award of the Bid.
8. The successful bidder will enter into a contract with the City of Aurora.
9. The City reserves the right to reject or accept any or all proposals or portions of proposal.
10. Bidders shall read thoroughly and understand the specifications in relation to the bid that is submitted. If the bidder has any questions concerning the true meaning or intent of the specifications or any of the requirements stated herein, bidder shall request the specifications interpretation in writing by **March 30, 2023** and an addendum shall be issued by the City which shall be made available to all bidders to whom specifications and other relevant material have been issued. Failure to have requested an addendum covering any such questions shall not relieve the bidder from performing the work in accordance with the intent of the bid.
11. Any bid received by the City after the stated opening time will not be honored by the City. There will be NO EXCEPTIONS. Bidders shall be responsible for the actual delivery of the bids during business hours to the address indicated. It shall not be sufficient to show that the bid was mailed in time to be received before scheduled closing time for receipt of bids
12. A legible list of all prevailing wage rates **must remain** posted in a prominent and easily accessible place at the worksite by each contractor and subcontractor on the project. The notice must be posted during the full time that any worker is employed on the job. Section 290.265 RSMo.
13. All bids must be received by **Monday April 10, 2023 at 10:00 a.m.** Bids will be publicly opened at that time with bid being awarded at a later date.

BID SPECIFICATIONS**

I. GENERAL BID SPECIFICATION INFORMATION:

Description of work to be performed by Contractor:

Furnish all material, labor, tools and equipment, and perform all work necessary to construction specifications: resurfacing of streets, to include the application of asphalts by machine or grader, tack oil and primer.

The scope of work included in the project may be subdivided into individual street projects or city projects as subsurface preparation is completed. The Contractor shall install asphalt surface on individual street projects at the direction of the City of Aurora, Missouri. The City shall provide the Contractor with "Notice to Proceed" with individual street projects a minimum of 72 hours prior to the date that the asphalt surface is desired to be installed. The Contractor shall install the required amount of asphalt surface directed by the City of Aurora within (72) seventy-two hours of receipt of "Notice to Proceed" with any individual project requiring 500 ton or more of asphalt material.

All paving will be required to be completed by September 01, 2023. Work should be coordinated with Jason Jordan, Public Works Superintendent, at 417-229-9741.

II. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

Bidder shall submit with this bid a certificate of insurance showing evidence of adequate insurance coverage.

Bidder shall maintain insurance coverage in the following amounts:

The City of Aurora shall be named as an additional insured on successful Bidder's General Liability, Auto and Excess Liability. Bidder's insurance carriers must be an "A" rated company pursuant to Best ratings.

Liability coverage shall be primary to any insurance maintained by the City of Aurora.

Such certificates shall afford the City of Aurora thirty (30) days written notice of cancellation or material change of coverage. If necessary, the City of Aurora shall have the right to obtain the required insurance, at Bidder's expense, to the completion of the services under this Agreement. City of Aurora reserves the right to review the actual policies of Bidder's insurance coverages as listed above.

III. BOND REQUIREMENTS

A. Performance Bond. Bidder must include with a submission of their signed contract a Performance Bond in the amount of 100% of the total bid amount.

IV. TIME FRAME

Bidders shall include on the Bid Form the estimated time frame needed to complete this repair design project. **All paving will be required to be completed by September 01, 2023.**

V. LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

Bidders shall recognize that time is of the essence regarding this project. If the work is not completed within the time frame specified in the executed contract, the successful Bidder will agree to pay liquidated damages for delay (but not as a penalty) to the City of Aurora

in the amount of \$200 per day for each day that expires after the time specified until the work is substantially complete.

VI. SAFETY TRAINING

For all public works construction contracts the Bidder shall comply with the requirements of Section 292.675, RSMo, which requires all contractors or subcontractors doing work on the project to provide, and require its on-site employees to complete, a ten (10) hour course in construction safety and health approved by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (“OSHA”) or a similar program approved by the Missouri Department of Labor and Industrial Relations which is at least as stringent as an approved OSHA program. The training must be completed within sixty (60) days of the date work on the project commences. On-site employees found on the worksite without documentation of the required training shall have twenty (20) days to produce such documentation.

The contractor will forfeit a penalty to the contracting public body of \$2,500 plus an additional \$100 for each employee employed by the contractor or subcontractor, for each calendar day, or portion thereof, such employee is employed without the required training.

VII. WORK AUTHORIZATION PROGRAM

Bidders are informed that pursuant to Section 285.530, RSMo, as a condition of the award of any contract in excess of five thousand dollars (\$5,000), the successful bidder shall, by sworn affidavit and provision of documentation, affirm its enrollment and participation in a federal work authorization program with respect to the employees working in connection to the contracted services. Successful bidders shall also sign an affidavit affirming that it does not knowingly employ any person(s) who are unauthorized aliens in connection to the contracted services.

VIII. EXCESSIVE UNEMPLOYMENT IN MISSOURI RSMo 290.560

For all public works construction contracts the Bidder shall comply with the requirements of Section 290.560, RSMo, which requires that only Missouri laborers and laborers from nonrestrictive states may be employed on the project when a period of excessive unemployment exists in Missouri.

Nonrestrictive states and territories (states and territories which workers may be employed on public work projects, during periods of excessive employment) are: Alabama, American Samoa, Arkansas, Georgia, Guam, Hawaii, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Michigan, Minnesota, Nebraska, New Hampshire, New Mexico, New York, North Carolina, Northern Mariana Islands, Ohio, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Puerto Rico, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, Vermont, Virginia, Washington and Wisconsin.

IX. PROOF OF LAWFUL PRESENCE RSMo 208.009

Contractor must provide “proof that the applicant is a citizen or a permanent resident of the United States and is lawfully present in the United States. “Forms of acceptable verification include”:

- Driver's License
- Any documentary evidence recognized by the Department of Revenue when processing an application for a driver's license.
- Any document issued by the Federal Government that confirms an alien's lawful presence in the United States.

X. PREVAILING WAGE

“**Not less**” than the prevailing hourly rate of wages, as set out in the wage order attached to and made part of the specification for work under the contract, **must** be paid to all workers performing work under the contract.

“The contractor will forfeit a penalty to the contracting public body of \$100 per day (or portion of a day) for each worker that is paid less than the prevailing rate for work done under the contract by the contractor or by any subcontractor.” See (290.250)

Bidder must submit prevailing wage payroll documents weekly. The Affidavit of Compliance must be submitted to the public body before final payment can be made to the Contractor.

XI. TRANSIENT EMPLOYER

Every transient employer, as defined in section 285.230, RSMo must post in a prominent and easily accessible place at the work site a clearly legible copy of the following: (1) The notice of registration for employer withholding issued to such transient employer by the Director of Revenue; (2) Proof of coverage for worker's compensation insurance or self-insurance signed by the transient employer and verified by the Department of Revenue through the records of the division of workers' compensation; and (3) The notice of registration for unemployment insurance issued to such transient employer by the Division of Employment Security. Any transient employer failing to comply with these requirements shall, under section 285.234, RSMo be liable for a penalty of five hundred (\$500) dollars per day until the notices required by this section are posted as required by that statute.

OVERTIME and HOLIDAYS

OVERTIME

For all work performed on a Sunday or a holiday, not less than twice (2x) the prevailing hourly rate of wages for work of a similar character in the locality in which the work is performed or the public works contracting minimum wage, whichever is applicable, shall be paid to all workers employed by or on behalf of any public body engaged in the construction of public works, exclusive of maintenance work.

For all overtime work performed, not less than one and one-half (1½) the prevailing hourly rate of wages for work of a similar character in the locality in which the work is performed or the public works contracting minimum wage, whichever is applicable, shall be paid to all workers employed by or on behalf of any public body engaged in the construction of public works, exclusive of maintenance work or contractual obligation. For purposes of this subdivision, "**overtime work**" shall include work that exceeds ten hours in one day and work in excess of forty hours in one calendar week; and

A thirty-minute lunch period on each calendar day shall be allowed for each worker on a public works project, provided that such time shall not be considered as time worked.
